
School Boards in the U.S.

Public Participation at Board Meetings

Policy

 It is the policy of the Board to encourage public participation at its meetings.

Background

- Public participation is very important to the successful function of the _____School
- The Board wants to carry out its business with the benefit of public input and expertise.
- It also wants to keep the public informed and up-to-date on what is happening in the school.

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Persons who may address the Board

- 1. Any District resident
- 2. School staff members, students and parents
- 3. Individuals who have been requested by the ...Board to present a given subject
- 4. Persons who are directly affected by matters on the Board agenda
- 5. Others at the discretion of the Board

Complaints about Instructional Materials

Policy

It is the policy of the ______School to provide for fair and impartial review of any complaint about instructional materials used by the District.

Implementation

- 1. The Principal will develop procedures to implement this policy.
- 2. All complaints will be reported to the Principal, whether received by telephone, letter, or in personal conversation.
- 3. The Principal or his or her designated representative will contact the complainant to discuss the complaint ...and attempt to resolve it informally by explaining the philosophy and goals of the School District and/or the library media center.
- 4. If the complaint is not resolved informally, ...

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Effective School Board Members

- Keeps student learning and achievement as primary focus;
- Values, supports and advocates for public education
- Keeps confidential matters confidential
- Understands that authority rests with the Board as a whole, not with individuals
