








OZ RURAL PARLIAMENT IN SLOVAKIA



The mission of OZ VIPA SK is:

Promoting the improvement of the quality of life in rural areas to support rural initiatives in managing rural development.

The mission of OZ VIPA SK is:

VIPA SK approached this mission mainly by promoting integrated rural development through professional advocacy and information and communication activities through a dialogue conducted at a national level by identifying rural needs at the national level.



Advocacy activities include in particular:



A. Reviewing state legislation and strategy papers to meet rural needs



B. Participation in the work of evaluation and monitoring bodies in order to comply with the law, transparency in decision-making, equal treatment, and respect for rural interests



C. Protests against decisions that do not match the interests of the countryside and defend the parties concerned.

In particular, information and communication activities include:



A. Convening the Forum of the Rural Parliament once every two years



B. Obtaining, processing, and disseminating rural and rural information



C. Exchange and dissemination of rural development experience and knowledge D. the development of rural education.

The Rural Parliament Forum - History

- The first idea of establishing the RPF in Slovakia emerged at the end of 90's years, after the speech of Swedish specialist Kjell-Roger Karlsson.
- VIPA became familiar with the Swedish experience and apply it to Slovak conditions.
- The first RPF was held in Levoča in October 2000: There were 4 working groups, encompassing the following themes: Landscape, Policy, Economy, and Human Being.
- The event has been organized under the auspices of President of the Slovak Republic



One of the most important objectives of RPF is to unite the voice of rural areas in order to be able to influence politics.

The Rural Parliament Forum Aims and Objectives

The RPF is the place to catch up on the latest developments and a place to expose current issues, worked in rural areas, to the authorities, the Government, and the National Parliament.

It is also an important forum for the exchange of experiences, a meeting place, and a source of inspiration.



- Frequency: every two years
- Duration: two days (usually Friday and Saturday)
- Location: the event takes place in different regions across Slovakia, the location is selected by Presidency of VIPA
- Participants:
- The Organisations at the national and regional level
- Specialists and experts from the area of rural development
- The public sector: municipalities, micro regions
- The political sector: politicians at local, regional and national levels
- International guests
- In average 100 participants



- Plenary session: providing a summary of the previous forum and the implementation of the passed resolutions
- Workshops: working in a chosen working group according to the themes, it includes presenting a positive example of rural development, the introduction of the topic by lecturers, discussion
- Evening Reception: cultural programme, informal discussion
- Working groups: Presenting outcomes of workshops, proposals of resolutions of the RPF (to be followed in next two years)
- The event includes an accompanying exhibition of traditional folklore, cuisine, the historical, cultural and natural heritage of the host region

After the event

The Presidency communicates with participants and resolutions of the RPF are passed to relevant ministries and institutions.

The Presidency and the VIPA members define the funding, resources, implementations of projects, with the aim to comply with the resolutions passed by RPF.

Advocacy

- Conclusions from the Forum are sent to the relevant Ministries.
- Last year we were invited to the Ministry of Transport and Construction of the Slovak Republic for a working meeting on the document Strategy for the Development of Sustainable Tourism until 2030.
- Then in February 2020, we were at a meeting of the working group to support the endogenous growth of the regions. (the same Ministry)
- A member of the working group of the Minister of Labor, Social Affairs and Family of the Slovak Republic for the method of applying the basic conditions in the preparation of the implementation mechanism of the EU cohesion policy after 2020 in the conditions of the Slovak Republic
- A member of the working group for the preparation of the Strategic Plan CAP 2021 2027
- A member of the Government Council for NGOs, we are part of advocacy for the third sector, which regularly challenges the government and issues requests and statements

The result of RPF (output of CAP working group)

Sheep and Goat Breeders Association – VIPA's board members (Ms. Kováčiková, Mr. Herian)

Slovak lamb is returning to the counters of Slovak shops after many decades. This happened after negotiations between the Minister of Agriculture and Rural Development of the Slovak Republic, and representatives of the Association of Sheep and Goat Breeders in Slovakia and traders.







- Will be held in Zvolen, Slovakia on 23 24 October 2020
- Four main topics of RPF will be:
- 1. Climate change
- 2. Family farming
- 3. Rural Youth
- Sustainable development of rural areas and local initiatives
